## Instructions for Rolling the Torah (*Gelilah*)

After the reading from a *sefer Torah* has been completed at a synagogue service, the Torah is lifted and displayed to the congregation by the *magbiah*. The *golel* (or *golelet*) then rolls the Torah and dresses it in its covers.

- When the magbiah (person lifting the Torah) has sat down, approach the chair and grasp the two handles of the Torah
- Roll the Torah tightly, preferably ending up with a seam between the two rollers;
   the magbiah will help with this.
- The gabbai (member who had been helping with the Torah reading) will hand you each article to put on the Torah when you are ready for it. If the magbiah is holding the Torah correctly, its front (the side with the writing) will be facing him/her and you will be facing the back of the Torah. Therefore, the front of each of the articles you put on the Torah will be facing the magbiah.
  - Fasten the belt around the center of the Torah, with the buckle toward the front; you will need to reach around the Torah.
  - Put the cover on the Torah, getting the two rollers through the openings at the top of the cover.
  - Put on the breastplate
  - Put the yad (pointer on a chain) onto the left-hand roller (left as you face the back of the Torah)
  - Put on the crowns.
- Shake hands with the Rabbi, the President, the magbiah once he/she has
  handed the Torah to the gabbai, the Bar/Bat Mitzvah celebrant, and other people
  on the bimah and return to your seat in the sanctuary.
